Creating a Tribe

You are on your 4th week and your kids hopefully have a good grasp of what is going on. Part of being a tribe is having a shared language. You will become more effective when they know what's going on and understand the consistency of the READ IT, SEE IT, LIVE IT, TELL IT strategy.

Read It Recap

We really want each month to be very simple. We want to create a pattern that into months 2 and 3 the students will start to recognize. For the kids to really memorize these verses they are going to have to see them every week.

STUDENT DOES GOSPEL STEP UP

GOSPEL PRESENTATION

“We know that it is easier sometimes for us to want to get revenge instead of showing love but Christ has called us to do the opposite. Jesus told us to love our enemies. This may not always be the most popular way to act nor the easiest. Christ demonstrated this for us even in his most difficult situation. On the night that Christ was betrayed by his friend Judas he did not fight back and even when his friend Peter fought back He stopped him.

We are all sinners, meaning we do things that break God’s rule and disappoint Him, making us enemies of Christ. But, He did not treat us as enemies instead He showed us love.

The Apostle Paul wrote in the Bible to the followers of Jesus in the city of Colossae

‘For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him’ [Jesus], ‘and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross. Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now he has reconciled you by Christ’s physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation— if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven.’ Colossians 1:19-23

Jesus reconciled us with God. He was our peacemaker. He took our punishment for being enemies of God making a way for us to have a relationship with God. This is the greatest example of someone loving their enemy.

We were His enemies and He loved us. He proved that by giving His life for us and our sin. And Jesus’ loving sacrifice can make us good. This is the Gospel, the Good News.”

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GIVE STUDENTS A CHANCE TO RESPOND

We all share a passion to make sure our children understand the gospel and turn to Christ in genuine salvation. As you present the gospel at FPKids it is important to remember that a true response involves both repentance and faith.

We don't need to confuse these responses to an invitation as repentance:

- Raise your hand if you want to go to heaven
- Repeat the sinner's prayer
- You need to be baptized
- Make a decision to follow Jesus today!
- There is no doubt that true conversations have come from these methods. These also can lead to a false assurance of salvation that can be dangerous. We ask that every decision made is discussed with a trained FPKids volunteer so that the kids can understand these Biblical truths. This will also help get them back to a local church.

The following are some points of emphasis to keep in mind as you guide kids to understand the Gospel:

- Talk a lot about who Jesus is (God-Man, Savior, Lord, King) and what He has done (died for our sins on the cross, rose from the dead).
- Make it clear that all people need their sins forgiven and will be judged for their sins if they are not saved.
- Urge children to turn from their sins and trust in what Jesus has done.
- Invite children to talk to you further about their relationship with God.
- Motivate parents to pursue further discussions with their children.
- Think long-term. Think how you can continually disciple children vs. how many "decisions" you can record.
- Pray for the children, and expect God in His grace to use the gospel to bring them to true, saving faith in Christ.
