GOSPEL PRESENTATION:

READ MATTHEW 1:23

JESUS WAS IMMANUEL - GOD WITH US

“You have probably heard this before if you and your family read the Nativity story for Christmas. I know this can be confusing. Obviously they didn’t name Jesus Immanuel? His is name is Jesus. So why does it say He will be called Immanuel? Immanuel means “God with us” and that’s who Jesus was and is. For God so loved the world that He gave us His only Son, Jesus. Jesus is God who became man, God with Us.”

“I want to read you something that Paul wrote that is also found in the New Testament that explains this more.”

READ PHILLIPIANS 2:3-11

HE TOOK THE NATURE OF A SERVANT - OBEDIENT TO DEATH ON A CROSS

“Let’s clarify this and make it simple. Jesus is in His very nature God, Immanuel, God with Us. But He chose not to use His power to make Himself like the other Kings and Rulers in the world. Instead He made Himself a servant and humbled Himself. He is greater than all of us, but He loved us and thought of us. He loved us so much that He even died for us. And it was a terrible death on a cross.”

“That is why He is the greatest and Jesus is the name above all names. He told us the greatest will become a servant and He proved what He said was true. Jesus who was perfect, called Immanuel - God with us, died for us and our sins so we could be saved. And He calls us to be servants, because that’s who He was.”

## GIVE STUDENTS A CHANCE TO RESPOND

We all share a passion to make sure our children understand the gospel and turn to Christ in genuine salvation. As you present the gospel at FPKids it is important to remember that a true response involves both repentance and faith.

We don't need to confuse these responses to an invitation as repentance:

- Raise your hand if you want to go to heaven
- Repeat the sinner's prayer
- You need to be baptized
- Make a decision to follow Jesus today!
- There is no doubt that true conversions have come from these methods. These also can lead to a false assurance of salvation that can be dangerous. We ask that every decision made is discussed with a trained FPKids volunteer so that the kids can understand these Biblical truths. This will also help get them back to a local church.

The following are some points of emphasis to keep in mind as you guide kids to understand the Gospel:

- Talk a lot about who Jesus is (God-Man, Savior, Lord, King) and what He has done (died for our sins on the cross, rose from the dead).
- Make it clear that all people need their sins forgiven and will be judged for their sins if they are not saved.
- Urge children to turn from their sins and trust in what Jesus has done.
- Invite children to talk to you further about their relationship with God.
- Motivate parents to pursue further discussions with their children.
- Think long-term. Think how you can continually disciple children vs. how many "decisions" you can record.
- Pray for the children, and expect God in His grace to use the gospel to bring them to true, saving faith in Christ.
